TITLE:

Youth-Led Resolutions on Strengthening Education, Health, Social Accountability and Inclusive Service Delivery in Nebbi District

PRESENTED BY:

The Nebbi District Youth Parliament, Kucwiny Sub County Youth Parliament, and Nyaravur–Angal Town Council Youth Parliament

1. Introduction

This position paper consolidates priority resolutions emerging from structured youth parliament sittings in Nebbi District. These sittings brought together young leaders, community representatives, and technical officers to deliberate on persistent service delivery gaps affecting children, adolescents, and young people.

The resolutions presented here are grounded in evidence shared by school communities, local health units, and youth groups. They highlight the urgent actions required to strengthen education outcomes, enhance health service responsiveness, promote inclusion, and reinforce accountable governance systems at district and sub county levels.

The paper is therefore submitted for formal consideration by the District Technical Planning Committee (DTPC), sectoral committees and civil society partners, with the expectation that these resolutions shape planning, budgeting, implementation and oversight processes for FY 2026/27 and beyond.

2. District-Level Priority Resolutions (Nebbi District Youth Parliament)

2.1 Deployment of Female Teachers at Jafurunga Primary School

The absence of female teachers remains a barrier to girls' safety, retention, and academic participation. The district's commitment to deploy at least one female teacher by 30 January 2026 is noted.

The Youth Parliament requests:

- Verification of the school's readiness to receive a locally arranged stand-in female teacher as an interim measure.

- Deployment of **three female teachers** to ensure adequate gender-responsive support for girls.
- If the deployment commitment is not met within the agreed timeframe, reassignment of female teachers from schools with six or more female teachers.

2.2 Ensuring Accessible Information for Youth-Led Evidence Generation

Youth-led monitoring requires timely, credible district data.

The Youth Parliament recommends that all service delivery departments systematically share accurate information to strengthen evidence gathering, reporting and technical submissions.

2.3 Regulation of Additional School Fees and School-Based Charges

To protect vulnerable households:

- Schools should levy extra fees only through transparent agreements with parents and guardians.
- The district should review and standardize school fees structures to ensure affordability.

2.4 Inclusive Health Service Workforce

Nebbi General Hospital should prioritize recruitment of at least one staff member with sign-language skills to enhance access for young people and adults with hearing impairments.

2.5 Institutionalizing Youth Parliament Resolutions

The district is requested to formally receive and table youth parliament resolutions as planning and budgeting position papers for integration into DTPC processes and sectoral deliberations.

2.6 Construction of full classroom blocks in Jafurunga Primary School

The limitation of classroom blocks remain a barrier in retention of pupils at school where by from P1 to P3 are studying under the trees. The district through the office of the DEO and Planning department should prioritize construction of Classroom blocks from P1 to P7.

2.7 Deployment of a visiting doctor in Kucwiny H/C III

Kucwiny H/C III serves a large catchment area covering three districts of Nebbi, Pakwach, and Madi Okollo. The districts should at least deploy one visiting doctor to handle specific referral cases.

2.8 Provision of internal examination to learners.

For all learners to be promoted to the next class they must all do exams to determine their promotion and yet some parents still fails to pay the levied examination fees. The district through the office of DEO and CAO to prioritize provision of internal examinations for all learners in all government schools across the district.

3. Kucwiny Sub county Youth Parliament Resolutions

3.1 Increased Budget for Community Dialogues and Youth Operations

To strengthen adolescent health advocacy and teenage pregnancy prevention, Kucwiny Sub County should increase the community dialogue budget from **UGX 400,000 to UGX 1,000,000** in FY 2026/27.

3.2 Functional Youth-Friendly Corners

PHC and RBF resources should support revitalization of youth corners, including indoor games and youth-responsive materials.

3.3 Establishment of Girls' Changing Rooms in All Schools

All schools across the district should be equipped with functional menstrual hygiene management spaces.

3.4 Expanded Health Outreaches for Young People

Facilities should scale up targeted outreaches, especially in hard-to-reach areas, using PHC and RBF allocations.

3.5 Tracking School Enrolment and Dropouts

Schools should maintain updated records on enrolment trends and dropout cases for data-informed planning.

3.6 Equitable Teacher Deployment

The district should ensure fair posting of teachers, including guaranteeing at least one female teacher in every government primary school.

3.7 Student Feedback and Safety Mechanisms

Schools should establish suggestion boxes and sensitize learners on GBV reporting pathways to address VAC and SGBV cases.

3.8 Regular Youth Parliament Sitings

Kucwiny Sub county leadership should institutionalize regular youth parliament sitings for sustained youth engagement and accountability.

4. Nyaravur–Angal Town Council Youth Parliament Resolutions

4.1 Bylaw Development on Sexual Violence Case Interference

Sub counties should initiate bylaws introducing penalties for individuals who attempt to negotiate or settle sexual violence cases outside legal frameworks.

4.2 Strengthening Youth Corners

Health facilities should functionalize youth-friendly corners using PHC and RBF funds, with active support from HUMC leadership.

4.3 Parental Awareness on Education

CDOs should prioritize parental sensitization on school retention during community awareness activities.

4.4 School Attendance Support by Sub county Security Teams

Security teams should reinforce school attendance by identifying children loitering during learning hours and facilitating their return to school.

4.5 Fair and Affordable Local Taxation

Sub counties should review local tax obligations to ensure they are fair and manageable for communities.

4.6 Increased Budget for Youth Council Operations

The Youth Council budget should be increased from **UGX 500,000 to UGX 1,000,000** in FY 2026/27 to enhance youth leadership and accountability activities.

5. Conclusion

These resolutions represent structured youth demands rooted in lived realities and local data. Integrating them into planning and budgeting processes will strengthen service delivery efficiency, improve outcomes for children and adolescents, and enhance local governance responsiveness.

The Youth Parliaments request formal acknowledgment, detailed feedback, and clear timelines for action from the District Technical Planning Committee and responsible departments.

respectfully submit this petition seeking urgent and structured action on the
following matters:**

1. Deployment of Female Teachers at Jafurnga Primary School

We request:

- Immediate verification of readiness for a temporary local female teacher.
- Deployment of **three female teachers** to the school.
- Reassignment of teachers from over-staffed schools if deployment timelines are not met.

2. Access to Information for Evidence-Based Youth Advocacy

We petition that all district departments provide timely and accurate information for youth-led monitoring and technical reporting.

3. Regulation of Additional School Fees

We request the district to enforce that extra school fees only be introduced through agreements with parents and guardians.

4. Review of School-Based Charges

We petition the district to collaborate with relevant authorities to standardize school fees to protect vulnerable households.

5. Recruitment of a Sign-Language Skilled Staff Member

We request prioritization of at least one sign-language trained staff member at Nebbi General Hospital.

6. Formal Tabling of Youth Parliament Resolutions

We petition the DTTC to institutionalize the receipt, review and integration of youth resolutions into planning and budgeting cycles.

7. Deployment of a visiting doctor in Kucwiny H/C III

We request the district to deploy a visiting doctor to assist in

8. Construction of a full classroom block in Jafurnga primary school

We petition the districts to construct a full classroom block in the school to ensure all learners in classes study inside classrooms.

9. Provision of internal examination to all learners.

We request the district to provide internal examinations for all learners in all government school across the district.

Resolutions from Kucwiny Sub county Youth Parliament

10. Increased Budget for Community Dialogues

We petition that the allocation be raised from **UGX 400,000** to **UGX 1,000,000** in the FY 2026/27 budget.

11. Functionalization of Youth Corner

We request that PHC and RBF funds support full revitalization of youth-friendly corners.

12. Provision of Girls' Changing Rooms

We petition for changing rooms in all schools to support menstrual hygiene management.

13. Expanded Health Outreaches

We request targeted youth outreach services in hard-to-reach communities.

14. Tracking Enrolment and Dropout Cases

We petition for mandatory documentation of enrolment trends and dropout data.

15. Equitable Deployment of Teachers

We request fair distribution of teachers, including female teachers in every school.

16. Student Safety and Feedback Mechanisms

We petition for suggestion boxes and GBV referral pathway sensitization in all schools.

17. Regular Youth Parliament Sessions

We request institutional support for regular youth parliament sittings.

Resolutions from Nyaravur–Angal Town Council Youth Parliament

18. Bylaws against Informal Settlement of Sexual Violence Cases

We request immediate drafting of bylaws that criminalize negotiation or settlement of sexual violence cases outside lawful systems.

19. Strengthening of Youth Corners

We request PHC and RBF-funded improvements in facility youth corners.

20. Parental Sensitization on Education

We request increased emphasis on school retention during community mobilization.

21. School Attendance Support by Security Teams

We petition that sub county security teams help address absenteeism during learning hours.

22. Review of Local Tax Levies

We request the review of local taxes to ensure affordability.

20. Increased Budget for Youth Council Operations

We petition for a budget increase from **UGX 400,000 to UGX 1,000,000** to support youth leadership and accountability work.

We humbly request that the District Technical Planning Committee and responsible departments:

- Formally acknowledge receipt of this petition,
- Provide clear timelines for action,
- Integrate these priorities into the FY 2026/27 planning and budgeting processes,
